Summer Art Camp is 8 weeks long and consists of weeklong AM (9am-12pm) and PM (1:30pm-4:30pm) sessions. All day campers are welcome to sign up to stay for lunch for an additional fee.

Who can take classes?

Art Camp classes are designed for children entering specific grade levels in the 2025-26 school year, including Kindergarten, 1st–2nd grades, 3rd–5th grades, and 6th–8th grades. Additionally, we offer Wee Art classes for children ages 2–4 who are entering Pre-K. These classes are shorter, last only one hour, occur less frequently, and require an accompanying adult.

What does it cost?

Classes hold a maximum of 10 students, and all supplies are included, including a snack halfway through each class. Costs are as follows:

Wee Art classes provide a creative and engaging introduction to art for children ages 2–4 alongside their caregivers. Designed to foster a safe, fun, and hands-on learning environment for those entering Pre-K, these sessions focus on process-based art experiences that encourage exploration and creativity.

Older siblings are welcome to participate but must be registered separately. Younger siblings in strollers may attend unregistered.

- 3. **Size**: The artwork should fit within the box on the shirt to ensure it fits on the shirt properly don't worry, the box will not be printed on the shirt!

By submitting your child's design, you agree that the artwork may be used in promotional materials for the Museum of East Texas. The Museum reserves the right to edit, modify, or adapt the design as needed for printing, formatting, or promotional purposes.

How do I submit the design?

Turn in your design to the front desk by March 31. Make sure your first name and age is on the paper so we can share the winner on our social media! Winner will be announced on April 11.

How do I get a shirt?

Students enrolled in Art Camp by April 30 will get a free shirt with their purchase. Shirts will be available for pick up by the start of Art Camp.
